Seventy-eight members were in attendance.

Minutes of the 2006 Annual Meeting: Reading of the minutes was dispensed with since copies had been mailed to the membership and was available at the meeting. There were no corrections.

Condolences: A moment of silence was observed for the following deaths. Sam Chapman, Irma Nebel, and Tony Sopchik.

Financial Report: Treasurer Berleen Carlton gave the following financial report. The year began with a balance of \$2,356.18 in checking and a CD of \$1,145.24. Including receipts and disbursements the current balance is \$2,435.16. Dues continue to be collected for the 2007-08 year. SIA will continue to make the same donations as in the past to the various community groups. No questions or discussion.

Lake Quality Report: Roger Rieckman reports that Stormy Lake continues to be one of the clearest lakes in Wisconsin. The last reading showed a clarity reading of 30 feet. There is no evidence of any invasive species or crayfish. We were reminded to continue to keep our boats clean and free of any weeds from other lakes. Mike Wenzholz informed us that not only do we need to wash our boats, but also we need to keep our water skis, life jackets, and other objects that get multiple lake use clean.

Fish Report: 13,050 Brown Trout were stocked. The Small Mouth Bass are healthy. Mike Wenzholz informed us of a potential threat to our lake called the VHS fish virus. This virus has not been detected in Northern Wisconsin, but it is a very serious and hard to control disease. Much is still being learned about the prevention and treatment of this virus, and we are encouraged to be vigilant about protecting our lake. On June 10, the Milwaukee Journal gave Stormy Lake some unwanted press about fishing on our lake. Many errors were noticed in the article and luckily we have not seen an increase in usage.

Various residents shared there have been sightings of geese, bear, otter, fox and loons.

Jack Pines continue to be under threat from the bud worm. Many residents have removed all Jack Pines from their property on the advice of the DNR. Nancy Wurmlee reported seeing the worm on her young Red and White Pines.

The water level of Stormy is very low. Some believe it is a cycle and have seen it this low in years past.

All were encouraged to attend the pancake breakfast in Conover to help raise funds for the volunteer fire department. They are trying to raise money to buy an EKG machine for the ambulance.

Burning permit rules have changed and are more restrictive. You must call an 800 number before you burn each day. The rules are on the permit, so please read.

Don Hennessy is looking for any contacts to help get high speed internet access to Stormy Lake. Cliff Anderson told us the provider will change within the year.

Mike Wenholtz has the updated guidelines for shoreline development. Anyone can contact him for more information.
