

The Annual Meeting of the Stormy Lake Association was held at the Conover Town Hall on July 6, 1991.

Officers and directors present were: Hugh Wurmle, Eleanor Williams, Berleen Carlton, Paul Garside, Walter Grabenstatter, Lois Johnson.
Absent: Dorothy Brust, Clifford Walin.

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by President Hugh Wurmle.

The minutes of the 1990 Annual Meeting were read and approved after the following correction: The comment about Lyme disease was made by Mrs. Richard Denis.

Hugh Wurmle announced that the chairman of the picnic committee is Sharon Douthit. Those planning to attend the picnic on August 10 were urged to contact Sharon after July 12. This is an opportunity for people to get together during the summer, especially for those who are not able to attend the Colorama Dinner.

Eleanor Williams gave the treasurer's report, showing a balance of \$1,430.52. Motion to approve the report was made by Gary Carlton and seconded by Ed Brust. Carried.

Auditing Committee - DeHayne Williams reported that he had examined the treasurer's books and found all records to be accurate. Wayne Straessle also served on this committee.

Hugh thanked all Board members for their contribution to the Association, especially outgoing members Nancy Urban, Eleanor Williams, Paul Garside, Dorothy Brust and Clifford Walin.

Hugh also thanked Bob Money for his alert about the heliport petition and Cliff Walin for his help in maintaining a list of names and addresses on his computer.

The Nominating Committee report was given by Ed Brust for Dorothy Brust.

Bob Money presented a gift to Hugh for his two years as president.

Paul Garside reported that entries are still coming in for the fish contest. The contest is open until noon of the day of the Colorama Dinner. Reports should be made to Paul Garside or Bob Money. Paul commented that a 5# small mouth bass has been caught. He also mentioned that the lake is 14" higher than last year.

The door prize, a loon calendar, was won by Lois Johnson.

Members who are ill: James and Edythe Blommer, Les Hedstrom, Arnold and Millie Carlson. Millie Carlson is suffering complications of Lyme disease. Wayne Straessle suggested that cards be sent to Larry and Jere Anderson, who are quite ill.

Motion was made by Stella Garside to make up a traveling plaque listing past presidents, to be kept by the current president and displayed at the Colorama Dinner. Seconded by Mary M. Wurmle. The daughter of the first president, Ray Schaus, spoke in favor of the motion. Motion carried.

Hugh reported that Vernoy Johnson had presented a map together with a suggestion that members help to clean up the road around the lake. Hugh suggested that people take a garbage bag with them as they walk and help to pick up litter as they go.

Many trees were cut along East Stormy Lake Road in the spring, and tree stumps have been left. If residents are disturbed by this, it was suggested that they contact one of the officers or permanent residents and we will deal with this as a group.

Nancy and Jerry Urban spoke regarding the tree stumps. The Town of Conover will remove them if requested.

New Business

Ed Brust commented about jet skis and urged people to keep them farther out in the lake. He also commented that the public boat landing has become a garbage disposal area and a disgrace to the lake.

Ed Brust asked if it would be possible to have Stormy Lake reassessed for tax purposes. There has been a 40 to 45% increase over the past couple of years.

Ed Brust commented that some trees had been hit by the snow plow. He does not think trees five feet off the road should be hit by plows. The Township Board has determined that they have right-of-way on each side of the road.

Judy Kirby asked if we can check with other areas to see what they do. Hugh suggested that the Board can check with someone in Vilas County to see what rules they follow regarding right-of-way. Bob Money thinks the Association should expect the town to clean up the mess.

Dennis Laabs moved that the president appoint a task force to formulate a policy and communicate to the Township regarding right-of-way clearance. Seconded by Gary Peterson. Dennis Laabs spoke to the motion and asked for a report at the Colorama Dinner. Carried.

Nancy Urban suggested that we ask those who want to serve on this task force to so indicate.

F. L. Kirby asked about the snowmobile route. Ed Brust said that a request had been turned down by the Snow Buddies since it is too costly to put up signs. Stella Garside suggested that more people join the snowmobile club.

X Motion was made by F. L. Kirby that we contribute \$20 to the Snow Buddies annually. Seconded by Kathy Peterson. *(Glenn Miller - Buckle taken)*

X Stella Carside commented that the Snow Buddies have been sued by people who have been injured. *back to JJ*

John Halloin suggested that a contribution to the Snow Buddies be made with the purpose of getting approval for road access.

Motion carried.

Motion was made by F. L. Kirby that we appoint a task force to go before the president of the Conover snowmobile association, Glenn Miller, to present problems and other snowmobile concerns. Seconded by Warren Anderson.

Jerry Urban suggested that individuals can join the Snow Buddies by contacting Debbie Jensen. Russell Johnson advised that the Association should not become a member of this organization.

Motion carried.

Jim Russell asked interested persons to sign up to serve on this task force.
